

# KALAMUNDA PISTOL CLUB

## RANGE ORDERS

ADOPTED DATE 02/11/20

These Range Orders have been established to ensure the health and safety of Kalamunda Pistol Club members and other members of associated clubs, visitors and the general community at large.

All persons entering Kalamunda Pistol Club premises must sign in our club register on arrival, the date, time in and time out must be completed. By signing the register, you agree to adhere and enforce Kalamunda Pistol Club Range Orders.

These range orders are to be read in conjunction with the West Australian Pistol Association (WAPA) and Pistol Australia (PA) rules and regulations. The range orders will take precedent over WAPA and PA safety rules if they infringe in wording or meaning. All range orders previously distributed are to be destroyed.

### A. Firearms

1. Handguns either pistol or revolvers from Calibre 5.6mm/ .22" to 9.06mm/ .357" are the only firearms allowed to be discharged from the three outdoor ranges. Pistols magazines must not be capable of holding more than 10 rounds.
2. Black Powder handguns have no calibre restrictions and are allowed to be discharged from the three outdoor ranges.
3. Air Pistols and Air Rifles of the calibre 4.5mm/ .177" are the only firearm allowed to be discharged from the enclosed Air range.
4. No firearm is to be uncased except at the firing line or in the designated safe area.
5. Lead projectiles must be used in all match's and practice. Jacketed Hollow Point target pistol projectiles may be used for matches that allow the use of them on our ranges. All Pistol Australia matches that allow projectiles other than lead must be constructed with a hollow point in the jacket with lead exposed either at the nose or in the hollow.
6. Power Factor of 142,000 is maximum allowed on Range A, B and C

### B. Ranges

1. The two red flags, one at the North East end of the 50-meter range and the other at the front gate must be raised before shooting on the outdoor ranges and both must be lowered at the end of the days shooting.
2. Shooting is allowed on the outdoor ranges between 8.00 am and 6.00 pm only.
3. Air range can be used day and night.
4. The range floor must be clean of any spent cases of any calibre at the end of the days match or practice.
5. No live round or malfunction round is to be left on the range or in the range bins. They must be taken home and disposed of correctly if faulty. This includes live centre fire primers and black powder caps.
6. Two safe areas are provided, one at the rear of the 50-meter range shed and the other at the rear of the 25-meter range shed. Both can be used to clean and repair firearms. All live ammunition is not allowed in the safe area.

7. All ranges are down the line ranges which means the barrel must be pointed down range at all time, this includes firearms coming out or into the gun bag or box, coming out or going into a holster, unloading or loading during a match or practice.
8. Definition of down the line at KPC ranges the barrel must never point more than half a target to the left or right of the competitors target or group of targets, the barrel must rise either from the 45 degree or from the holster in a straight vertical line of the centre line of the target into which the first fired shot is to hit. The barrel must not be higher than the top of the target at any time except for a revolver that once the chamber has been open only then may be raised slightly higher to help eject live or spent cases from the chamber.

## C. Rules

1. The Range Officer (RO) at Club level is in charge of the range in use, either at a match or practice day. All RO commands must be obeyed.
2. The RO, competitor, spectator and guest are equally responsible for the safe use of the ranges and must all help maintain this by bringing any safety violation to the attention of the RO or other range official or in the case of a practice day to the member who has committed a safety violation and then all safety issues are to be reported to the Club committee.
3. No firearm barrel is allowed to be pointed any higher than 1 meter above the top of the targets
4. ISSF, PA, WA1500 and NRA Match rules and regulations establish uniform standards for every competitor and are to be used. The KPC Range orders are designed to suit KPC ranges and must be followed by all persons using the range faculties.
5. Any shot fired before the command to load in any match or any shot fired in Action Match before the start of a series will be in breach of Range Orders.
6. No firearm power factor is to exceed 142,000 (bullet weight in grains x velocity in FPS)

## D. Penalties


1. Competitors who commit a violation in any Match, are to be penalised as per the rules of the match, unless they are in breach of Range Orders then Range Orders are to apply.
2. Breach of Range Orders, a person or persons found in breach will be dismissed from the club faculties at the earliest time possible, the offending person/ persons must have his/her firearms cleared and cased. The person involved should be told of the exact charge. No argument is to be considered at that time. The RO or person in charge should write a note on the proceedings as soon as possible after the event. This note and either a verbal or written statement is to be given to the Club Captain or the Committee. The committee will decide the outcome once all facts have been evaluated.
3. Any club member who uses full metal jacket (hard ball) ammunition on KPC ranges will be expelled from the club.

**The committee will always support the RO or person for reporting the offence.**
